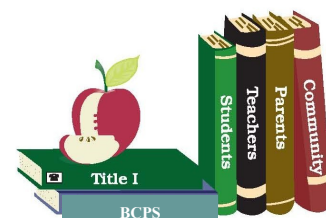
Parents will be given the opportunity to provide feedback on the PIP and Home-School Compact.
